
The Call for Abstracts deadline is April 21.

- <u>Submitting an Abstract</u> or a poster paper at PNSQC is a time-tested, friendly process. We make it <u>as easy as possible</u> for you to submit.
- All authors who present at the conference will be privy to <u>peer review and other resources</u>, and will be rewarded by having their work published by a recognized organization with over 30 years of history in improving software. Worried about presenting? Don't be. We also <u>offer tips</u> and access to people who will help you make your presentation the best it can be.
- The two-day conference admission fee is waived for authors chosen to make a presentation.
- · Writing a paper and attending the PNSQC conference counts towards professional development and adds value to an individual's team effectiveness and marketability.
- PNSQC is allocating sessions for other software organizations to promote themselves at this year's conference. All we ask is that someone in your organization submit an Abstract as a representative of your organization.
- · When your team submits an abstract, you'll earn significant benefits at the conference. By teaming with PNSQC in this way, you'll have an opportunity to showcase your specialty while
